

Music in the PYP

We have a very active music department at LIS. Children start music in PP3 and are encouraged to participate in many different ways, developing knowledge and understanding of the subject as well as creative skills.

The music curriculum in the PYP is made up of five strands – performing (singing), performing (playing instruments), creating and composing, notation and listening and appreciation. Through their time in the PYP, students will have the chance to play both untuned and tuned percussion instruments, kazoos, recorders, boomwhackers, melodicas, bells and keyboards. Music is sometimes linked with the class Unit of Inquiry, but where a natural link does not present itself, it is taught as a stand alone unit.

All children take part in a production once a year, as well as performing items in class presentations and assemblies. Performing in this way helps the children build confidence and further develop cooperation skills.

Extra curricular activities, such as a choir, are also offered in music.
